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Opening Prayers

Christ is risen!
He is risen indeed, alleluia!
Happy Easter to all around you!

Today is the day Christians around the world celebrate the resurrection,

The day we recognise the potential for new life,

The day we get to look for the miracle of God overcoming evil and darkness,

In the Jesus story, but also in our own lives.

May I use this time to turn aside and come to worship God,

Responding to the reading

As dawn breaks on Easter Sunday, may you find yourself immersed once again in the profound story from Luke's gospel, where women disciples arrive at Jesus' tomb to find it empty. This story, bursting with themes of surprise, revelation, and divine intervention, invites us to explore the transformative power of God's grace in our lives, particularly through the resurrection.

The women, carrying spices to anoint Jesus' body, are met not by the finality of death but by an astonishing emptiness and a divine message: "He is not here; he has risen!" This unexpected turn of events underscores the nature of grace—it often catches us unawares, overturning our expectations and opening new paths where we anticipated dead ends. Reflect on moments in your own life when grace has surprised you, transforming your despair into hope, or your uncertainty into clarity. How have these experiences shaped your understanding of God's work in your life?

The angelic messengers prompt the women to remember Jesus' words, that he would be crucified and rise again on the third day. Their reminder points us to the importance of grounding our faith in the promises of Christ, even when they seem impossible from a human standpoint. In the light of the resurrection, we are invited to trust deeply in what we cannot yet see, assured by what we have been promised. As you celebrate Easter, consider the promises of Jesus that you need to hold onto more firmly. How does the resurrection empower you to trust in these promises?

Upon hearing the angels' message and remembering Jesus' words, the women respond with action: they return from the tomb and tell the apostles what they have seen and heard. This action illustrates a key aspect of discipleship: encountering God's grace compels us to witness. Easter challenges us not only to revel in the joy of the resurrection

but also to share this foundational truth with others. Reflect on how you can bear witness to the resurrection in your daily life. Who needs to hear this message of hope from you?

The apostles' initial response to the women's testimony is skepticism. They consider the story "nonsense." This reaction is a stark reminder that the message of grace, though powerful, is not always easily accepted. It runs counter to human nature, which is often selfish and tends towards meritocracy. It invites us to be patient and persistent in our witnessing, trusting that the truth of God's grace will eventually take root. Consider times when your own faith or the faith you've shared has been met with skepticism. How can you continue to faithfully witness to the resurrection, embodying grace and patience?

This Easter, let the empty tomb remind you that God's grace defies expectations, transforming endings into new beginnings, and sorrow into joy. Embrace the surprise of grace, remember the promises of Christ, and respond by sharing the incredible news of the resurrection. May you find fresh ways to live out and proclaim the transformative power of grace, inviting others into the hope and renewal that Easter represents.

May your celebration be filled with the awe and joy of the women at the tomb, and may your heart be renewed in the promise that life, indeed, triumphs over death.
