

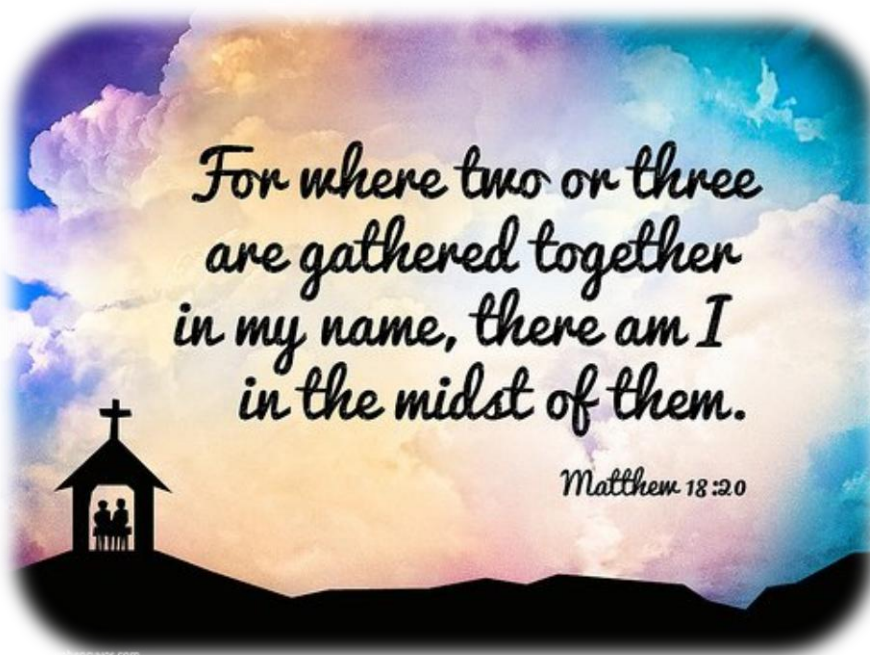

Bible Conversations Teesside:

We are joining in with a mission initiative headed up by the Bible Society and taking place across Teesside from September. At its heart it's about sharing faith with people through conversations, initially individually, but also with an opportunity to explore the bible in small groups. We've been provided with several copies of an introduction to the bible and Jesus' story beginning with Luke and Acts to give away. As a starting point, we're asking you to pray for open hearts and minds and opportunities to share and talk about faith. We are planning to have an open 'Bible Conversations' event on the 27th of September. If you want to know more about the initiative and the event, then please speak to Andrew, Christine, or Clare. There's going to be a 'Good Conversations' workshop held on Friday the 11th of September, 10 am at Stokesley Methodist Church, to be led by Helle Sewell the District Mission Enabler; the aim to help support people in opening up faith conversations.
